



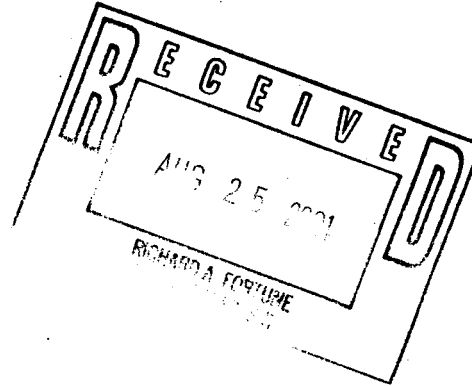

The Department has always taken the position that as stated in foonote number 26, sec. 102.13(1)(b) that the phrase "any necessary expenses the employe will incur in submitting to the examination" includes the wage loss that the applicant will sustain as a result of submitting to such examination. A loss of wages is in our view a necessary expense. If Dr. Lubar's office is in fact, more than 100 miles from Mr. Clark's residence, as provided by sec. 102.13(4), the applicant would not have to appear at Dr. Lubar's office. Mr. Fortune provides no explanation of circumstances which warrant an examination more than 100 miles from the applicant's residence.
