or testimony from Dr. Goldsmith being introduced into evidence in this case must be raised at the time of the hearing. The ruling on any such objection will be left to the discretion of the presiding administrative law judge.

The hearing scheduled in this case on March 17, 1993 in Madison will not be postponed at this time. This case has been scheduled for a 4-hour hearing. It has been a long-standing policy of the Worker's Compensation Division to not schedule any hearing for more than 4 hours at one time. We have followed our policy in scheduling the hearing in this case. I recommend that the parties streamline their cases as much as possible so that all evidence can be presented during the allotted hearing time. If the hearing cannot be finished during the time allotted, a concluding hearing will be scheduled in this matter. In the event that a concluding hearing is necessary, the parties should discuss this with the presiding administrative law judge at the time of the hearing.
